

A singular initiative in favour of the visually impaired: The Naples International Airport is the first Italian airport to publish timetables in Braille.

Gesac is promoting a singular initiative in favour of the visually impaired by publishing their English and Italian versions of flight schedules in Braille. In addition to domestic and international flights in and out of Naples, the visually impaired will also be able to access information and telephone numbers for various airport services, parking, ticket offices, shops, etc as well as transportation information for the city of Naples, leading cities in the Province of Naples and the major area resorts.

Tommaso Sica, President of the Italian Union of the Blind expressed "appreciation for the notable sensitivity and awareness on the part of Gesac in providing the blind with an instrument which facilitates self reliance and autonomy in full consideration of their well-being and social liberties".

"It is the duty of an international airport such as ours to provide for the needs of our disabled clients. All service providers, be they in the public sector or the private sector, should contribute to the principle of equal access for all by guaranteeing that even the more disadvantaged categories of clients are able to enjoy equal quality of services" stated Gesac General Director Gabriele Renzulli.
